# SUMMER SCHOOL

This event takes place in the framework of the second Summer School of the Pestalozzi Programme of the Council of Europe organised in cooperation with the Academy of Bad Wildbad. The Summer School replaces the training seminars jointly organised since 1978 (a total of 134).
